David Rios, Library Director, accepts position at UCR

David Rios, director, Del E. Webb Memorial Library, has accepted the position of Assistant University Librarian for the Sciences at University of California, Riverside (UCR) as of January, 2001.

David began his work at the Del E. Webb Library in 1984 as editor of the Seventh-day Adventist Periodical Index. In 1986 David became associate director, and director in 1990.

Under David's leadership many positive changes have occurred in the Library. Among the major items are:

- Installation of a new integrated library system which provides efficient catalog, acquisitions, circulation, and serials modules that share information and improve functionality.
- Networked electronic resources, including WebbLine databases and electronic journals, that

have become a major portion of what the library offers.

- Significantly improved computer availability and accessibility.

- Strengthening of the liaison program (see the list below to contact your liaison librarian).

Know your liaison librarian: Liaison assignments change

The Del E. Webb Memorial Library's liaison program provides one librarian to work with each program or School on campus. Liaison librarians assist students, faculty and staff with information needs. General tours are offered by librarians to new students. Lectures and hands-on workshops may also be arranged to suit course-specific needs. Liaison librarians are available for office hour consultations. Faculty engaged in schol-

arly research for article and book publication are encouraged to contact their liaison. In addition, liaisons work with their programs and schools to make sure the library collection supports program and research needs.

PDQ includes a database of approximately 1,800 active cancer clinical trials that are open to patients worldwide and more than 10,500 closed cancer clinical trials.

New printers and copiers installed— exchange old copy cards at Circulation Desk

New digital photocopying and printing equipment is now available in the Library. The new equipment is higher quality, faster, and adds new color capabilities. The system is enabled for both photocopying and printing from computer terminals.

New cards may be purchased from a dispenser unit on the third floor near the Reference Desk, or from the Circulation Desk. Cards purchased at Circulation may be charged to student or department (by requisition) accounts.

Charges for printing/copying are as follows:

Black and white—\$.08 per page. Color copies—\$.80 per page. Coin copies (black and white)—\$.15 per page.

New cards are available in amounts of \$5.00, \$10.00, and \$41.00 (this includes the \$1.00 card deposit). The \$1.00 deposit for the card will be refunded when the card is returned.

Value on old cards may be transferred to new cards at the Circulation Desk.

Store and update your own searches

New Cubby feature released in PubMed

The National Center for Biotechnology Information and National Library of Medicine have released a new feature of PubMed called Cubby that allows users easily to store and update searches.

To use Cubbys, go to PubMed <http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/entrez/query.fcgi>, click on “Cubby” and register. Then, enter a search and click on “store in cubby”. Next time you login to Cubby you will see a link for that stored search. To update your search, click the check box, then click “what’s new for selected” to retrieve only new since you last ran that search.

The Cubby also includes LinkOut Preferences so users may customize their LinkOut display to only see links of interest to them. LinkOut includes supplemental material relevant to the linked citation.

AMEDEO

Free Medical Journals on the Internet

The Free Medical Journals Site from AMEDEO is a service of Flying Publisher, a group dedicated to sharing medical information over the Internet. Supported by grants from commercial companies, Free Medical Journals links to free full-text medical journals, and provides a free alerting service which e-mails weekly updates of a personalized web page of the researcher’s selected journals. A researcher can also join an online conference on a group of major topics like infectious diseases, neurologic disorders, immunology, and hematology. For some journals, only selected articles may be provided in full-text.
